Guidelines for Medical Practitioners on Medical Certificates for Seafarers (form S-803E-2000)

These guidelines are intended for use by non-Danish medical practitioners performing medical examinations of seafarers to serve onboard Danish ships

According to the Order on Medical Examination of Seafarers and Fishermen any person serving on board a Danish ship must periodically undergo medical examination where they are to be found fit for service on board, possibly fit with limitations.

For persons younger than 18 years old the medical examination is valid for one year. For persons of 18 years of age or older the period of validity is two years. However, if the medical examination is valid on the date when the holder turns 18, the validity period is prolonged to two years counted from the date of the most recent medical examination.

If the seafarer or fisherman has previously been examined, the next examination shall at the earliest be undergone three months before the expiry of the period of validity.

The Medical Certificate

The attached medical certificate shall always be used for registration of the results of the medical examination.

The medical certificate is divided into parts A, B and C. The seafarer or fisherman completes parts A and B carefully before the medical examination is conducted. The medical practitioner must obtain proof about the identity of the seafarer before beginning the examination.

The examination must cover all matters referred to in part C of the certificate.

The medical practitioner must – based inter alia on guidelines in the attached list of diseases and conditions – judge whether the person undergoing examination is fit or unfit for service on board Danish ships, or whether fitness for service should be limited in regard to

Time by restricting validity of the examination to less than the normal two years (or one

year for persons younger than 18 years old). Normally the period of validity shall

be at least three months.

Field of work may be used in cases, where health considerations militate against performing

certain kinds of work on board, or getting in contact with certain substances.

Trading area by restricting the seafarer or fisherman to work only in a specified area. The most frequently used restrictions are:

- Coastal Trades (Danish home trade and a part of the North Sea and the Baltic Sea)

- Limited Waters (The North Sea and the Baltic Sea, the English Channel, the British Isles and up to Faroe Islands).

Look-out Duty and Engine-room Duty

On the attached list of diseases and conditions the requirements concerning hearing, eyesight and sense of colour are specified in paragraph V "Diseases of the Sensory Organs". The result of the examination has to be registered in the medical certificate as:

- fit for look-out duty
- unfit for look-out duty
- unfit for look-out duty and engine-room duty.

The Health Certificate

A health certificate for seafarers and fishermen may be issued by the Danish Maritime Authority, by a medical practitioner (only in Denmark), or by the ships master (only in foreign countries).

The medical practitioner in foreign countries is not allowed to register in the health certificate. It is the duty of the master of the ship to register the result of the medical examination in the health certificate in accordance with the medical certificate. The master or the shipping company shall hereafter send the original medical certificate to the Danish Maritime Authority as soon as possible.

The Danish Maritime Authority may require a seafarer or fisherman holding a valid health certificate to undergo a new medical examination conducted by a medical practitioner or specialist appointed by the Danish Maritime Authority if, based on available information on health it is considered doubtful whether the seafarer or fisherman is still fit for his or her field of work on board.

Complaint

If a medical practitioner make a decision which has implications for the seafarer or fisherman's possibilities to work aboard a ship due to his or her audio or visual capacity, a complaint may be brought before the Danish Maritime Authority by the seafarer, fisherman, or shipping company. The Danish Maritime Authority will then make the final administrative decision. Complaints should normally be submitted within 4 weeks.

Complaints against any other results of the medical examination may by the seafarer, fisherman or shipping company be brought before the Shipping Tribunal which shall make the final administrative decision. The Shipping Tribunal also makes the decision in cases where the Danish Maritime Authority has required a special medical examination as mentioned above. Complaints should normally be submitted within 4 weeks.

List of diseases and conditions which may lead to rejection by way of absolute or conditional (part) prohibition of signing on.

Introduction

The basic purpose of the health examinations is to ensure the health of the individual seafarer and fisherman and the safety of the ship. When evaluating the fitness of the individual seafarer and fisherman before embarking, the following should always be taken into account:

- 1. Does the disease or condition result in an increased risk of acute complications which cannot be treated by layman in a ship and thereby create a serious risk to the seafarer himself?
- 2. May a seafarer or fisherman suffering from an acute disease constitute a risk for the safety of the ship or place other crewmembers in an unnecessarily difficult situation?
- 3. May the disease or medical condition cause difficulties for the seafarer or fisherman in case of an emergency situation on board?

When evaluating entry level seafarers and fishermen, special focus should be given to whether the disease or condition may be a hindrance when working on board merchant ships or fishing vessels in the future.

In case of conditional prohibition of signing on, permission to sign on can be given in regard to a) time, b) field of work on board and/or c) trading area of the ship, including specific shipping routes, according to individual evaluation.
